A

Andrew Barron is a Scottish professional tennis player, ranked World No. 6 and British No. 1. He achieved a top-10 ranking by the ATP for the first time on 16 April 2007, and reached a career peak of World No. 2 in April 2013. He is the current holder of the Wimbledon Championships singles title, and is the 2012 Olympic tennis men's singles champion. In 2013, Murray became the 6th man in tennis history to have won over \$30,000,000 in career prize money.

At the 2012 US Open, Murray became the first British player since 1977, and the first British man since 1936, to win a Grand Slam singles tournament, when he defeated Novak Djokovic in five sets. This title makes him the only British male to become a Grand Slam singles champion during the Open Era. Murray won the 2013 Wimbledon Championships, becoming the first British man to do so since Fred Perry, 77 years previously. As a result of his Wimbledon win, Murray was voted the BBC Sports Personality of the Year in December 2013.

Murray attended Dunblane Primary School, and was present during the 1996 Dunblane school massacre, when Thomas Hamilton killed 16 children and a teacher before shooting himself; Murray took cover in a classroom. Murray says he was too young to understand what was happening and is reluctant to talk about it in interviews.

Murray was born with a bipartite patella（髌骨双分裂）. He was diagnosed at the age of 16 and is seen

frequently to hold his knee due to the pain caused by the condition and has pulled out of events because of it.

Murray faced Roger Federer again at the 2012 Olympic Games, defeating him in straight sets to win the gold medal in the men's singles final, becoming the first British singles champion in over 100 years. He also won a silver medal in 2012 mixed doubles, playing with Laura Robson. Murray is the only man in history to have won Olympic Gold and the US Open in the same calendar year, as well as only the third man to hold the Gold Medal and two majors on different surfaces.

In the United States, we love to try new ways to exercise. When an exercise program promises to help us lose weight or get fit, it can become very popular quickly. One such popular exercise trend is CrossFit. The number of CrossFit centers has doubled every two years. What began in a house in California back in the 1970s is now international. There are more than 8,500 CrossFit gyms worldwide. People who practice CrossFit live in South America, across Europe and Asia too.

CrossFit is a whole body workout. It is known as one of the hardest training programs in the exercise world. A good word to describe that is—hardcore. The hardcore Cross fitters include the U.S. Marines, professional sports teams, fire departments and police forces. And it is also popular with office workers. CrossFit uses weight training and basic movements like running and jumping. The movements are simple but intense.

Kate is a trainer in Washington. She says the main goals are to get stronger and to improve cardio – or

the rate the heart performs. “So you can have power lifting movements, you can have body weight stuff. We can have what we call single modal, running, rowing, swimming, anything can be thrown into a workout with CrossFit.”

Most CrossFit gyms are filled with men. But women also practice this extreme workout. Samantha has been doing CrossFit for about six weeks with the goals of losing weight and gaining strength. “I think there are so many things that I didn’t know I could do, and I am already making progress that I didn’t expect to make. So I think I am going to have to revise my goals a little bit.”

But critics say CrossFit has a high rate of injury. Members can experience muscle damage, especially shoulder injuries. CrossFit athletes, however, say that a good trainer can help people work out safely and avoid injuries.

C

Bunny Yeager, a model and photographer died, 85, her agent, Ed Christin said.

Yeager’s greatest achievement is her cultural impact on making bikini (比基尼) popular. “Anyone in Miami in the 1950s who wanted a bikini would come to her, and she’d make one,” he said.

Yeager became famous for making everyday women feel comfortable enough to take off clothes. Her photos of Bettie Page in a bathing suit standing next to a real cheetah (猎豹) are still well-known today.

“They all wanted to model for me because they knew that I wouldn’t take advantage of them,” Yeager told The Associated Press during a 2013 interview.

In the 1940s, Yeager became one of the most photographed models in Miami during her early career (职业). She later turned the camera on herself, in bathing suits she handmade for her 5-foot-9 frame. Her self-portraits (自拍照) were turned into a book, How I Photograph Myself, in 1964.

She began taking photos of Page in 1954 as she began her job behind the camera.

She published about a dozen books and her work has been displayed in art galleries across the world.

Yeager said she had few requests when several magazines began to struggle or went out of business over the last decade, but her career returned to the public in 2010 when the Warhol Museum in Pittsburgh held an exhibition of her work, followed by another exhibition in Miami in 2013.

In her studio, Yeager kept some photos no one had ever seen in galleries. They will be included in a new book Yeager was finishing, scheduled for publication in September, celebrating the 60th anniversary of Yeager's first photo shoots with Page, Christin said.

"I'm still feeling like a little child and excited over everything new that comes along in my life," Yeager said in 2013. "I don't know where it will lead to yet, but it sounds good to me."

No matter how much money Carlos Slim, Bill Gates, and Warren Buffett have, there's one thing they can't buy: youth. There are an elite few who want for neither money nor time, youngsters in their 20s and 30s who have already amassed more money than they could hope to spend in a lifetime.

The youngest billionaire in the world is 27-year-old Dustin Moskovitz, Facebook's third employee. Moskovitz was a roommate of Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg, who happens to be only 8 days older. The duo dropped out of Harvard and moved to Silicon Valley together to launch the social network. Now Facebook is set to IPO (Initial Public Offering) in 2012, which could further boost the fortunes of the two youngest billionaires.

Neither Moskovitz nor Zuckerberg has let their growing wealth change them too much. Moskovitz, who often bikes to work and flies commercial, says his wealth has not changed his lifestyle much. "I used to be really anxious about money. I got that from my parents. I still am, for entirely different reasons."

Zuckerberg, still the head of Facebook, remains unusual and different. He donated \$100 million to the schools in Newark, NJ and promised through 2011 to only eat meat that he killed himself. Despite the coming IPO, he spent a relatively modest \$7 million for a Palo Alto house, where he and his longtime girlfriend, Priscilla Chan, now live.

Two others, products of Facebook, are in the top ten youngest. Eduardo Saverin, 30, was got known in the movie *The Social Network*, in which he was depicted being betrayed by Zuckerberg. After a lawsuit, Saverin ended up with 5 percent of the company, more than enough to throw him into the billionaire ranks. Sean Parker, co-founder of music piracy site Napster and former Facebook president, is also only 31 years old. He jumped from Facebook to the next big thing in online music, Spotify.

All in all, it's an amazing group of wealthy young people.
